

CHRISTINE KRAYNACK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Deadline for applications is: September 26 of each year.

Christine’s family set up this scholarship for students planning on or already attending Youngstown State University or Kent State University. Christine was born in Poland in 1937. She and her family were not Jewish but during World War II they were placed in a work camp.

Eligible students can be of any faith but must be of Polish descent and/or demonstrate familial ties to the Holocaust (i.e., be a descendant of a Survivor). The award will be \$250 or 5% of the available funds, whichever is greater, and will be sent directly to the school. The scholarship can be used for tuition, fees or books. If awarded, the student must send a thank you note to Christine’s family care of Courtney Campesi at the address below.

This grant offers need-blind incentive grants of \$1,000 to first time campers who are entering 4th grade or higher and are enrolled in a full session program. Young Judaea and Hadassah offer limited need-based tuition assistance for Young Judaea programs.
